LD AN ACT TO PROVIDE SPECIAL PLATES OR PLACARDS PL 1987
1685 FOR HANDICAPPED PERSONS C. 298

SUMMARY: The bill reinstates the authority of the Secretary of State to issue special designated license plates to handicapped persons. It assures qualified handicapped persons the choice of designating license plates or placards.

The Senate amendment, as enacted, makes handicapped persons who have registered motorcycles eligible to receive special designating registration plates.

LD AN ACT RELATING TO LOCAL BRIDGES PL 1987 c. 325

Sponsor: STROUT D, Nadeau GG, Callahan, Cahill Committee Report: New draft of LD 925

SUMMARY: The original bill makes minor adjustments to the local bridges legislation passed by the 112th Legislature. First, it specifies that the town must notify the Department of Transportation of the town's approval of the project. Second, it permits local bridges to be built by local forces if approved by DOT's Chief Engineer. Third, it makes the State responsible for capital improvements and maintenance of bridges crossing federally designated systems.

The new draft adds to the original bill and makes it clear that the State is also responsible for State owned and State-aid bridges on any federally designated system. The local share of costs for townway bridges on a federally designated highway shall not exceed the cost as calculated under the Local Bridge program.
