SUMMARY

LD 2167 proposed to create a 9 member study commission to review the procedures and methods used by the Maine Job Service to assist people looking for employment.

The Maine Job Service has had to significantly cut back the number of people located at its several job service offices throughout the State. The cut back has been created by the withholding of federal funds to State job service divisions throughout all the States.

For the purpose of better meeting the needs of the public, LD 2167 proposed to study the increased reliance on computers and the significant reduction in job counseling as well as the degree that the division is employer "driven" and not employee oriented.

Since the Committee on Audit and Program Review is scheduled to review the Department of Labor this year, the Committee on Economic Development requested the Audit and Program Review Committee to undertake the study proposed by the sponsors of the bill.
