SUMMARY

The bill would have created a new set of laws pertaining to the leasing of land. The contract between a lessee and lessor establishes the bounds of their agreement under existing law. The proposal contained provisions governing: the assignability of leases; the right of lessees to organize; access to leased lots; giving notice prior to forfeiture of lessee interest for rent default; the extension, renegotiation and termination of leases; and, it would have placed explicit limitations on the liability of landowners.

SUMMARY

The original bill would have created tougher energy efficiency standards for electrical appliances, to go into effect in 1993 when the federal standards are due for revision. The original bill also would have created energy efficiency standards for fluorescent lamp ballasts and electric motors. Finally, the bill called for a study of state electrical use.

The committee amendment deleted all provisions regarding appliances and electric motors. It includes an amended set of standards for fluorescent lamp ballasts which are consistent with recently introduced federal legislation. The study provision is amended to include the University of Maine System. The new study provision directs the state and university system to take full advantage of existing utility rebate and energy conservation rebate programs. The University System and the Bureau of Public Improvements are directed to report annually to the Committee on their progress under this program.
