SUMMARY

This bill establishes the Maine Family Development Foundation as a private, nonprofit corporation with the purpose of preventing child disabilities through strengthening family life and promoting the social health of children.

To attain that purpose, the foundation is authorized to perform education, research, studies and public and private partnerships with business, private enterprise, schools and a host of community-level service organizations. In addition to seeking private resources, appropriations are provided to make grants to local and regional groups which wish to conduct prevention projects.

The Committee Amendment provides for the transfer of the Maine Children's Trust Fund to the Foundation and the dissolution of the Board of the Trust Fund when assets of the Foundation reach \$200,000.

This bill was carried over by the Appropriations Committee.

SUMMARY

This bill makes changes in the certificate of need law. Its major provisions raise the financial limit for projects and capital improvements subject to CON review and eliminate the requirement for review of "major medical equipment," changes in certain bed capacities and termination of health service. It also provides "simplified review" and "emergency review" procedures and provides additional considerations for review.
