LD 1728 Resolve, Regarding the Release of Certain Ballots to the Municipal Officers of the Town of Jay

SUMMARY

This resolve authorizes release of ballots used in a town election in the Town of Jay for inspection to determine the source of a discrepancy between the number of votes cast and the number counted by a scanning device used to count the votes.

Committee Amendment "A" specifies that the town clerk, who has constructive possession of the ballots, not the Secretary of State, shall release the ballots for inspection. The amendment also provides that a representative of the Secretary of State shall be present when the ballots are inspected. Finally, the amendment provides for the return and disposal of the ballots after the inspection.

This bill allows retail licensees to purchase liquor directly from an agency liquor store as well as a state liquor store.

SUMMARY

This bill repeals a sunset provision which, on September 30, 1989, removes the State Liquor Commission's authority to issue licenses to special seasonal agency liquor stores.

Committee Amendment "A" delays the sunset for an additional year rather repealing it. The amendment also changes current law to allow the commission to license 4 rather than 6 special seasonal agency liquor stores.

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
