This bill specifies the conditions under which more than one person may be designated as beneficiary by members of the Maine State Retirement System with relation to each of the several types of death benefits that may become payable to those beneficiaries.

Senate Amendment "A" corrects an error in which the term "only one" was used rather than "more than one" in the part dealing with local district members.
