SUMMARY

This bill, as amended (H-762), authorizes the Public Advocate to petition to initiate proceedings on behalf of utility customers and ratepayers instead of merely responding to utility proceedings that have already been initiated by another party, typically a utility seeking a rate increase. These proceedings may be initiated at the Public Utilities Commission, the federal agencies regulating utilities and the courts. This will enable the Public Advocate to seek to reduce rates, or secure a refund for customer groups who have been overcharged at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission or the Federal Communications Commission, even if no proceeding is already underway.
