This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

**SUMMARY**

This bill includes veterans' auxiliary organizations among those groups eligible for a license to operate beano or bingo games.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-77) broadens the category of organizations eligible for a license by permitting an auxiliary of any organization qualified for a Beano or Bingo license to obtain a license in its own name. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.

**SUMMARY**

The bill would have created an exemption in the law on solicitation by law enforcement officers to enable a law enforcement agency to make its equipment, construction and maintenance needs known. See also LD 1682.

**SUMMARY**

The bill would have allowed an agency liquor store to increase the purchase price of certain items requiring refrigeration pursuant to rules of the State Liquor Commission.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-29), part of the minority committee report, would have clarified that the sales price for liquor may be increased only for items that are actually refrigerated, not those deemed to require refrigeration.
