## JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES

#### AUGUST 1991

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### **SUMMARY**

The bill replaces the probation supervision fee enacted in 1990. The fee enacted in 1990 is \$10 to \$50 per month; the fee in this bill is a one-time fee of \$50 to \$500. Fees collected under the 1990 law go to the General Fund; fees collected under this bill go to a dedicated revenue fund for the support of probation services.

A majority of the committee recommended an ONTP report. The minority of the committee recommended OTP as amended by Committee Amendment "A" (H-38), which removes those parts of the bill which create a dedicated revenue account.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill changes the amount received by counties from the Jail Operations Surcharge Fund. The bill increases the amount to counties from 22% of the Fund to 100% of the fund. (See LD 1616)
