The bill eliminates the requirement that there be a Traffic Violations Bureau in each separate division of the District Court so as to allow the Chief Judge to establish one or more locations for the receipt of waivers.

The bill would have given plaintiffs in small claims actions the ability to provide service of process on their own. The bill would have allowed the Supreme Judicial Court, through its rulemaking, to determine the rules regarding service of the statement of claim and notice of disclosure. See PL 1991, c. 9, Pt. SUMMARY

This bill allows the Supreme Judicial Court complete discretion to provide for procedures governing small claims by rule. See PL 1991, c. 9, Pt. E, §12.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-238) adds an emergency and provides that small claims rule may not restrict the number of claims that may be filed in any given period. It also adds an appropriation for 10 additional clerks to process small claims actions.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-427) to Committee Amendment "A" removes the appropriation section.
