This resolve requires the Department of Human Services to provide assistance to foster parents who have no health insurance by offering them group health insurance coverage and developing a cost sharing plan with the foster parents.

SUMMARY

This bill clarifies existing law regarding the confidentiality of investigatory files, bringing the laws on the obligations of the Bureau of Insurance into line with the provisions applicable to the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, as codified in Title 10, section 8003-B, except to the extent concerns unique to insurance warrant different standards. The bill provides a confidentiality law which allows for dissemination to the public of valid complaint information regarding companies in the form of complaint ratios. It clarifies provisions in the law pertaining to the confidential nature of actuarial or financial information received by the bureau with filings.
