### SUMMARY

This resolution proposed a referendum to amend the Constitutional by increasing the terms of office for Legislators from 2 year to 4 years, following the general election in 1994. The Legislature would have continued to meet every year, but the business in all even numbered regular sessions would have been subject to the same category restrictions that currently apply to the second regular session.

### SUMMARY

This bill allowed municipalities to accept funds provided by the Legislature or the Federal Government by including a general article to that effect on the town meeting warrant. It applied to town meetings held after January 1, 1991.

Committee Amendment "A" eliminated the proposed new section of law and amended existing law to include the option of using a general article to accept all state and federal funds while retaining the two original article options. The amendment also required that municipalities using the general article option obtain the approval of municipal residents for the final allocation of any additional funds the municipality accepts. This amendment does not effect the retroactivity section or the emergency clause.

Senate Amendment "A" allowed the use of a general article for acceptance of federal funds only.
