#### **SUMMARY**

This bill would have clarified the applicability of the laws governing site location of development. The bill would have established the concept of "integrated development scheme" to replace the "common scheme of development" provisions of existing Department of Environmental Protection rules.

The bill also would have transferred the responsibility for deciding whether the traffic requirements of the site location of development laws have been satisfied from the Department of Environmental Protection to the Commissioner of Transportation.
