JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES

AUGUST 1991

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

PUBLIC XXX	Chapter # of enacted Public Law
P&S XXX	Chapter # of enacted Private & Special Law
RESOLVE XXX	Chapter # of enacted Resolve
CON RES XXX Chapter # of C	Constitutional Resolution passed by both Houses

LD 537 An Act to Prohibit Persons Holding State, County or Municipal Office from Soliciting Election Funds from Their Employees

SUMMARY

This bill would have provided that state, county and municipal office holders may not directly solicit election funds from their employees and would have made any violation of this provision a Class E crime.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-40), part of the minority committee report, would have prohibited solicitation from any employee, regardless of whether the employee is directly employed by the office holder.

SUMMARY

This bill would have prohibited the use of wire on political advertising sign posts.

LD 557 An Act Concerning the Commission on Governmental Ethics and PUBLIC 86 Election Practices

SPONSOR(S) HANDY MAYO GWADOSKY COMMITTEE REPORT 0TP-AM AMENDMENTS ADOPTED H-67

SUMMARY

This bill prohibits the appointment to the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Elections Practices of a person holding the position of treasurer of a political action committee.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-67) replaces the bill and prohibits any officer of a political action committee, party committee or political committee from serving on the Commission.

SUMMARY

This bill would have amended the law requiring municipal clerks' offices to be open on the Saturday immediately preceding a statewide election by making this provision optional for municipalities having fewer than 2,500 registered voters.

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
