All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

The bill clarifies that for judgments of less than \$5,000, except in civil actions involving a contract or note containing interest provisions, prejudgment interest is computed at 8% and only from the date the complaint is filed.

SUMMARY

The bill establishes a Class B crime of hunting homicide. A person commits hunting homicide if that person, while hunting, discharges a firearm without identifying the target at which the person is shooting and a person dies as a result of being shot.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-400) replaces the bill. It provides guidance relating to the target-determining process to be utilized by a reasonable and prudent hunter.

SUMMARY

This bill more precisely defines harassment and specifies the characteristics to be considered for the charge of "harassment based on characteristics." It streamlines the type of harassment data the State Bureau of Identification is required to collect, namely harassment based on specific characteristics. This bill also requires the State Bureau of Identification to note when any crime was based on characteristics.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-223) deletes the proposed changes to the harassment and civil rights laws and amends the crime reporting statute to state specifically the types of characteristics that are apparent motivation for crimes that must be recorded, consistent with federal crime reporting requirements. The language tracks the federal Hate Crime Statistics Act. It also adds an effective date of January 1, 1992.
