This bill would have required that before a low-level radioactive disposal facility site is finalized, 60% of the voters residing within a 12-mile radius of a proposed site must approve its location.

SUMMARY

Currently, if a person transfers land they received as a gift from a relative to a nonrelative within 5 years, the land may be subject to municipal subdivision review. The original bill would have extended the exemption from subdivision review for gifts to a blood relative to include mortgage holders of that land.

The committee amendment (H-257) strikes the whole bill. In addition to the provisions of the original bill, the amendment allows the parcel of land to be subsequently transferred without municipal subdivision review so long as the parcel is not further divided. The amendment also extends an exemption from review under the site location of development laws to a parcel acquired by a mortgagor or the mortgagor's successor. Finally, the amendment adds an emergency preamble.

A House amendment (H-612) expands the applicability of this exemption to gifts of land to a municipality and to divisions accomplished by devise, condemnation and order of the court. However, the house amendment also limits the exemption to the original holder of the security interest and that person's successor in interest.
