SUMMARY

This bill eliminated the State's exemption from paying municipal building fees when obtaining permits for construction projects and public improvements to state-owned or leased buildings.

Committee Amendment "A" added a fiscal note.

SUMMARY

The bill required the State to reimburse the City of Augusta for a proportional share of the expense of providing public safety services to the Capitol Area. LDs 684 and 898 also provided for state reimbursement of some city costs and the amended version of this bill was intended by the committee to address the global issue of state reimbursement for city services.

Committee Amendment "A" modified the formula in the following ways:

- 1. Public safety expense was replaced by net public safety expense. The total actual public safety costs in the original formula were reduced by the amount of any fees collected for those services;
- 2. The net public safety expense submitted by the City of Augusta had to be reviewed, certified as appropriate and authorized by the Bureau of Public Improvements; and
- 3. The proportional share was limited to the value of the assigned risk assessment of state-owned, tax-exempt buildings in the Capitol Area.

Further, Committee Amendment "A" placed a cap of 10% of the amount determined through the formula on the sum of the reimbursement and established an effective date of July 1, 1992. The amendment also added an appropriation section and a fiscal note.

House Amendment "A" provided that the authorization and reimbursement were discretionary, struck the appropriation section and added a new fiscal note.
