An Act to Clarify Provisions Relating to Pharmacies

SUMMARY

The bill revises language that regulates the inspection and removal of pharmacy and drug wholesaler records by all law enforcement personnel. It expands the amount of time the pharmacy records can be removed for testing and duplication. It provides that photocopies of records furnished by investigators constitute a legal substitute for purposes of compliance with any other law or rule.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-290) changes the procedures to be followed by the law enforcement officers and prosecutors when investigating prescriptions for scheduled drug and controlled substance violations. It also limits persons who may inspect and remove records to the Board of Commissioners of the Profession of Pharmacy, the board's inspectors and investigators, specific federal and state law enforcement officers and other law enforcement officers authorized to act by the Attorney General.

The bill would have required that any hearing by the Board of Overseers of the Bar involving charges of attorney misconduct be conducted as an open proceeding.
