This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

CON RES XXX Chapter # of C	Constitutional Resolution passed by both Houses

LD 639 An Act Concerning Disclosure of the Names of Criminal Suspects (By Request)

SUMMARY

The bill would have protected criminal suspects who are actually innocent by prohibiting law enforcement officers and agencies from releasing the identity until the person is arrested or a warrant has been issued.

LD 644 An Act to Require Convicted Felons to Contribute to the Cost PUBLIC 355 of Rehabilitation Programs

SPONSOR(S)COMMITTEE REPORTAMENDMENTS ADOPTEDANTHONY0TP-AMH-359BUSTINFARNSWORTHPENDLETON

SUMMARY

The bill requires all fines and penalties for crimes to be credited to the Department of Corrections to be used for rehabilitation programs. It also doubles the maximum fines for Class crimes, and requires the court to assess a fine against every convicted defendant.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-359) amends the bill to strike out all the changes except the doubling of maximum fines. It requires the Commissioner of Corrections to provide rehabilitation programs within available resources.

The bill would have amended the current law regarding release of joint tort-feasors to clear up an ambiguity and to make the terminology consistent with the comparative negligence law.
