SUMMARY

This bill made participation by municipalities in the statewide E-9-1-1 emergency services communications system voluntary.

Committee Amendment "A" added an emergency preamble and an emergency clause to the bill and extended the deadline by which a municipality must designate a public safety answering point from July 1, 1991 to July 1, 1995. The amendment also maintained the mandatory participation feature of the original law. The amendment also repealed the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 453-A, which required that each county establish an E-9-1-1 public safety answering point at the expense of the Department of Public Safety.

This resolve would have required the Special Committee on the New Capitol Master Plan to consider alternate and futuristic means of addressing transportation, work and parking issues as it moves forward in implementing the initial recommendations of the progress report toward the development of the final report for the Capitol Area master plan. Further, it changed the final report date to January 15, 1992 and was retroactive to January 15, 1991. The language and intent of this resolve was incorporated the extension of the New Capitol Master Plan by Committee Amendment A to LD 1345.
