SUMMARY

This bill proposed to require the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to establish alternate-year opening and closing of certain ponds to ice fishing. The bill also proposed to establish a 2-line limit for ice fishing on great ponds managed for cold-water species. The committee's majority report amendment (H-132) struck the language of the bill and proposed instead to lower the ice fishing line limit on Class B waters from 5 lines to 3 lines. The amendment proposed to permit the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to set a different line limit not to exceed 5 lines. This provision would have been repealed on June 30. 1993.

SUMMARY

This bill proposed to limit the authority of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife with regard to the adoption of guidelines for the protection of endangered and threatened species. The bill proposed to require that State regulation be no more restrictive than federal regulations adopted under the federal Endangered Species Protection Act. The federal Act permits and encourages State laws to be more restrictive.
