JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES

AUGUST 1991

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

CON RES XXX Chapter # of C	Constitutional Resolution passed by both Houses

LD 649 An Act to Amend the Prohibition Against the Sale of Liquor on Sundays

The bill would have changed the hours that liquor sales are prohibited on Sundays from the hours between 6 a.m. and 9 a.m.

SUMMARY

This bill would have permitted clerks to test election ballots in their electronic voting machines several days before election day. The bill would also have required election wardens to process absentee ballots while the polls are open on election day, rather than after the polls close as required under current law. SUMMARY

This bill would have required voters or their agents to deliver absentee ballots to the municipal clerk at least 2 hours before the polls close, to permit any interested party to inspect the ballot envelopes and applications before the polls close. See LD 1053.
