### SUMMARY

This bill amends the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 6 to recognize that the National Transportation Safety Board is responsible for all aircraft accident investigations and is charged with making final determination as to cause. This bill further recognizes that the Department of Transportation's appropriate role is to provide assistance as needed to federal authorities in carrying out their responsibilities.

### SUMMARY

This bill allows the Department of Transportation to provide 100% of the nonfederal support for mass transportation capital items. This money is to be used to purchase spare parts and equipment for loan or lease to transportation providers on a statewide basis.
