This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

AMENDMENTS ADOPTED

SUMMARY

This bill requires that a new employer include an employee's service with a previous employer for the purpose of calculating benefits. Currently, members of the Maine State Retirement System may transfer between state employment and teaching without affecting their retirement benefits. However, in transfers between state employment and a local district, teaching and a local district or 2 local districts, it is up to the new employer whether to include a member's service under a previous employer with the service under the new employer for benefit calculation purposes.

AMENDMENTS ADOPTED

SUMMARY

This bill adds 2 members to the Board of Trustees of the Maine State Retirement System, one who is a member of the retirement system through employment as a participating local district employee, one who is appointed by the AFL-CIO, and one member of the retirement system appointed by the Maine School Management Association. The bill also increases the number of members needed for a quorum from 4 to 6 and the minimum number of votes needed to take action from 4 to 6. The bill also makes some technical corrections to the law.

SUMMARY

This resolve creates the Commission to Study a Long-term Disability Program for the Maine State Retirement System Members.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-171) changes the membership of the commission, adds an additional issue to be studied, makes changes to the manner of compensation and adds a fiscal note.
