## JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES

#### AUGUST 1991

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

## An Act to Preserve Public Ownership of Historic Fort Gorges in Casco Bay

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill set the price the State would pay for Fort Gorges, should the City of Portland decide to sell it. Existing state law already gave the State right of first purchase refusal.

Committee Amendment "A" granted the State the power to assign its right of first refusal to a Maine nonprofit historical or Maine nonprofit environmental group if a bona fide purchase offer for Fort Gorges was received by the City of Portland. The responsibility to continue public access to Fort Gorges as a public historical monument was required by the deed. The amendment also set the sales price at \$1 and added a fiscal note to the bill.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill would have required the Commissioner of Public Safety to establish a system of revised fees to recover the costs incurred by the Office of the State Fire Marshal for the review of construction plans and the issuance of the required construction permit.

Committee Amendment "B" amended the title and repealed the dedicated funding of the Office of the State Fire Marshal and the Maine Technical College System. It required that the proceeds of the fire insurance premium tax and the fees collected for plan review and issuance of permits be credited to the General Fund. The amendment further stated that the operation of the Office of the State Fire Marshal will be funded from the General Fund. The amendment also raised the maximum fees for plan review and the issuance of permits and added appropriation and allocation sections and a fiscal note to the bill.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill would have refined the evaluation criteria by which the Director of the Bureau of Public Improvements judges the performance of a contractor under the established prequalification process.
