This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

**LD 822      An Act to Issue Doe Permits to Physically Disabled Persons      ONTP**  
**Upon Request from the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and**  
**Wildlife**

**SUMMARY**

This bill proposed to provide for the issuance of a free antlerless deer permit to any disabled person who possesses a valid general hunting license.

**LD 868      An Act Regarding Deer Hunting      LV/MD**

**SUMMARY**

This bill proposed to allow a person who takes a deer during the special archery hunting season to take another deer during the regular deer hunting season. The bill provided that the possession of both deer so taken would not be a violation of the bag limit established under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 7458, subsection 1.

**LD 965      An Act to Require Hunters to Wear Fluorescent Orange in all      LV/MD**  
**Hunting Seasons**

**SUMMARY**

This bill proposed to require that hunters wear solid-colored orange clothing in all hunting seasons for any wildlife.

**LD 1029      An Act to Ensure More Equitable Hunting Opportunities      PUBLIC 170**

**SUMMARY**

This bill allows the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife by rule to extend the deer hunting season to the first Saturday in December in any year in which November 30th falls on a Wednesday, Thursday or Friday. The committee amendment (H-172) requires that in any year in which the commissioner by rule extends the season into December, the commissioner must also adopt split seasons for northern and southern zones of the State. In those years, the season must be opened in the northern zone one week earlier than it is opened in the southern zone.
