LD 1014 An Act to Amend the Shoreland Zoning Laws

SUMMARY

The original bill would have prohibited the Board of Environmental Protection from requiring municipalities to adopt certain restrictive provisions concerning nonconforming lots, nonconforming uses and zoning variances. Each local government would have been able to determine whether such measures were appropriate to the shoreland areas under its jurisdiction.

The committee amendment (H-434) retains the limitations on the Board's authority to require municipal review of a change from seasonal to year-round operation or changes of hours or days of operationby a nonconforming use under their shoreland zoning ordinances. The limitation on the Board's authority to restrict the availability of variances is also removed. In addition, the bill is amended to allow nonconforming lots of record in single or joint ownership on the effective date of this act to be considered as separate lots if they meet certain criteria.

SUMMARY

This bill would have required the Maine Low-level Radioactive Waste Authority to establish a plan to reduce the curie content and the volume of low-level radioactive waste in this State.

Committee amendment "A" (H-128) replaced the bill. The amendment requires the Maine Low-level Radioactive Waste Authority to investigate options for reducing the volume and curie content of low-level radioactive waste and permits the authority to make recommendations to low-level radioactive waste generators regarding options that are economically and technologically feasible and that are permitted by federal and state law.
