SUMMARY

This bill establishes formal GIS data management responsibilities in the Office of Geographic Information Systems within the Department of Conservation.

The bill shifts responsibilities from the Department of Conservation to the Information Services Policy Board. The Information Services Policy Board is authorized by law to establish fees and standards for agency information systems.

The Senate amendment (S-191) requires that the Office of Geographic Information Systems consider legislative requests as high priority. Charges may not be levied against the Legislature or any office of the Legislature for responses to legislative requests.

SUMMARY

This bill broadens the loan authority of the Finance Authority of Maine under their underground oil storage tank replacement loan program to include systems installed to improve air quality. The installation of this equipment is required by state law.

The committee amendment (S-218) amends the bill to add an emergency preamble and emergency clause and change a cross-reference. In addition, the amendment raises the interest rate the Finance Authority of Maine can charge and places a limit on the amount the authority can loan to one borrower from \$5 million to \$10 million. This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

The Senate amendment (S-260) makes a technical correction to the fiscal note.
