This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

**LD 1006 An Act to Amend the Laws Regarding Enhanced 9-1-1**

**SUMMARY**

This bill proposed to extend by two years the deadlines for the establishment of a statewide E-9-1-1 system.

**LD 1046 An Act to Amend the Proceedings for Approval of Interim Rates by the Public Utilities Commission**

**SUMMARY**

This bill proposed to allow electric utilities that filed a revenue request (rate case) with the Public Utilities Commission to receive a temporary rate increase during the pendency of the proceeding if the utility had not earned its allowed rate of return for three consecutive 12-month periods in the 15 months preceding the request for a temporary rate increase.

**LD 1060 An Act to Create a Limited Right of Entry**

**SUMMARY**

This bill proposed to grant to electric utilities a right of entry onto private property for the purposes of surveying and performing preliminary engineering and environmental testing to determine if the location is suitable for transmission lines.
