#### AUGUST 1991

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### SUMMARY

This bill made the following changes in the statutes governing Information Services:

- 1. It made the appointment of the Director of Data Processing subject to the provisions of the Civil Service Law;
- 2. It increased the membership of the Information Services Policy Board by adding representatives from a state criminal justice agency and a state natural resource agency;
- 3. It authorized that the appointment of the chair of the board was made by the Governor; and
- 4. It removed the Commissioner of Administration from the appeals process.

Committee Amendment "A" required that the chair be appointed from within the ranks of the Executive Department, and that the chair may not be the commissioner of the department in which the Office of Information Services is located.

This constitutional resolution proposed a referendum on limiting the number of terms a Representative or Senator may serve in either the House of Representatives or the Senate to 5 consecutive terms. A Representative or Senator who reached the limit would have been eligible to serve additional terms in the opposite house.
