LD 251 would have created a liquor license allowing small grocery stores to sell beer for off-premises consumption and for consumption on the premises along with the consumption of pizza, or other prepared food that the grocery store sells. The bill was carried over from the First Regular Session.

An Act Authorizing Presidential Primary Elections in the State

SUMMARY

The bill would have required the State to hold a presidential primary for selection of delegates to national nominating conventions. The primary would have been held on the same day as the New Hampshire primary, to facilitate a New England Regional primary.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-881), the minority committee report, would have changed the name of the primary from a presidential primary to a presidential preference primary, permitted persons who are nationally recognized as presidential candidates to be placed on the ballot, and permitted state committees of political parties to choose to call caucuses to select delegates to a national convention instead of having the candidates name the delegates. The amendment also would have made the Act effective for the 1996 election, and would have required the Secretary of State to report to the Legislature if the national convention refused to seat Maine delegates as a result of a defect in Maine's method of selecting delegates.
