This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

**LD 1162      An Act to Keep Portions of Foster Parent Licensing Records      ONTP**

**LD 1165      An Act to Amend the Preliminary Protection Order      ONTP**

**SUMMARY**

The bill would have provided that when a child is removed from the custody of the child's parents or guardian by a preliminary protection order, the location of the child may not be disclosed to the parents or guardian for 30 days unless the petition includes a sworn statement that release of the location information will not pose a risk of serious harm to any person.

**LD 1184      An Act to Amend Certain Provisions of the Maine Bail Code      PUBLIC 393**

**SUMMARY**

The bill rewrites part of the law on revocation of post-conviction bail to more closely parallel the law on revocation of preconviction bail. The Bail Code is also amended regarding reducing the declaration of forfeiture of bail to a judgment.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-237) revises language to make provisions governing preconviction bail consistent with post-conviction bail. The change addresses the role of the court when a defendant fails to appear as required, violates a condition of bail or is charged with new criminal conduct. The amendment also establishes procedures for the enforcement of forfeiture of bail through execution of the judgment and liens on real property, personal property and motor vehicles. These enforcement provisions apply to all bail obligations in effect on or after October 1, 1991 and all bail liens recorded as of or after October 1, 1991.

Senate Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "A" (S-287) adds the required fiscal note.
