JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES

AUGUST 1991

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

LD 1157 An Act to Amend the Teacher Retirement Laws

SUMMARY

This bill permits a President of the Maine Teachers Association to continue as a member of the Maine State Retirement System with the MTA paying the employer's share of the retirement costs.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-195) provides that for a teacher serving as President of the Maine Teachers Association "earnable compensation" is the amount that the teacher would have earned if the teacher had remained in a teaching position. The amendment also removes the reference to the length of the president's term, which could change in the future.

SUMMARY

This bill clarifies the definition of "earnable compensation" as it pertains to the Maine State Retirement System laws by limiting the length of a working day.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-186) deletes language defining a day as being limited to 8 hours of working time, for purposes of calculating "earnable compensation" under the retirement laws. The amendment is not intended to express any legislative intent with regard to the definition of day currently used by the retirement system.

SUMMARY

This bill makes the "automatic option 2" available to the beneficiaries of state employee and teacher members of the Maine State Retirement System who die while in service, regardless of the number of years of service or age at the time of death of the member.

This benefit will be available to beneficiaries of employees of a participating local district only after the district has adopted this provision in the manner set forth in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 18202.

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
