**SUMMARY**

This bill would have established a separate regulatory scheme for maintenance dredgings of coastal municipal or federal navigation dredging projects approved by the Federal Government prior to the effective date of the bill. To obtain a permit, the bill would have required certain notice provisions, testing of spoils, minimal fisheries impact and geologic suitability of the disposal site.

**SUMMARY**

This bill proposes to amend the ground water protection laws to conform with the Maine ground water management strategy, to implement the Maine Wellhead Protection Program as required by the 1986 Amendments to the federal Safe Drinking Water Act and to modify the current ground water classification system.

The Maine Wellhead Protection Program would delineate recharge areas of public water system wellheads, identify potential threats to ground water within the delineated areas, create local management programs for those potential threats and develop contingency plans for emergencies and for future needs. The ground water classification system would classify public and significant private community ground water supplies and provide for appropriate protection.

**SUMMARY**

This bill placed some control on funnel development by regulating the size and use of shorefront common areas.
