This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### SUMMARY

This bill would have permitted any descendant of a person buried in a burial ground or cemetery that is not accessible by public road or highway to have access on foot over the property of another person to that burial ground or cemetery. See LD 1547.

#### SUMMARY

This bill would have made several changes in the law regulating high stakes Beano conducted by federally recognized Indian tribes. The committee worked this bill with LD 1522, and many of the provisions of LD 1222 were included in the committee amendment to LD 1522.

This bill would have made the following changes in the laws governing high-stakes Beano: repealed the September 30, 1992 sunset date on the high stakes beano authorizing law, permitted the Passamaquoddy Tribe to conduct high-stakes Beano on 36 weekends a year instead of 18 as under current law, changed the license fee from 5% of revenue to \$50,000 per year, permitted high stakes Beano on Indian Territory, not just on the reservation, permitted advertising of door prizes and the sale of \$1 Lucky Seven tickets before during and after Beano games. The bill would also have allowed all Beano games to begin at 11:00 a.m. on Sunday instead of noon, and allowed for new ways of determining the winners in Beano games. See LD 1522.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill increases fees charged by the Office of the State Fire Marshal for several inspection services and for permits, licenses and certificates. The bill increases the fee for the inspection and licensure of certain dance facilities, for a fireworks display permit, a fireworks site inspection, and for a permit to discharge fireworks, for licensure of certain amusement devices, for a theater license, and for inspection of explosive storage magazines and magazines used to transport explosives.
