All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill prohibits users of automated telephone calling devices from dialing the telephone numbers of telephone utility customers who have notified the utility of the customer's desire not to receive such calls. The committee amendment (H-261) forbids telephone utilities from charging a fee for any action taken by the utility in response to a customer's request not to receive automated telephone calls.

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill amends the Gray Water District charter. As clarified by the committee amendment (H-260), the bill provides that a district trustee's term continues until the trustee's successor is elected and changes the time when a trustee's election must be held from the day of the annual town meeting to the day of the annual municipal election. The House amendment (H-419) makes the provision relating to the continuation of the trustee's terms retroactive.
