LD 1444 An Act to License Installers of Milking Equipment

SUMMARY

This bill requires that persons who install or repair milking equipment in this State be licensed. The bill requires that minimum standards of competency be possessed by persons installing milking equipment and that installers submit plans or designs of proposed installations to the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources for review and approval. Plans and designs must be reviewed by the commissioner to determine conformance with established industry standards.

SUMMARY

Currently, a person must be registered in order to be an electrologist. Passing a Department of Human Services inspection is the only requirement for registration. The original bill adds age, schooling and professional education requirements in order to be registered.

Committee Amendment "A" eliminates the professional education requirement. The Joint Standing Committee on Business Legislation has asked the Department of Human Services for a recommendation concerning professional education for consideration at the next session of the Legislature.

SUMMARY

This bill extends from 30 to 90 days the deadline for filing a statement of amount due for manufacturing or repair work done on vehicles, aircraft and parachutes to perfect mechanics' liens on that work. The time extension allows mechanics to determine if certain customers have abandoned responsibility for payment before undertaking the time and expense of filing the necessary papers to perfect their liens with the Secretary of State.
