SUMMARY

This resolve established the Commission to Study the History, Status, Impact and Role of Independent Higher Education in Maine.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-180) changed the membership of the Commission by clarifying that one member of the Senate and 2 members of the House of Representatives shall represent the legislature on the commission. The amendment broadened the category of business, education or community leaders to include labor leaders. The amendment also added an allocation section and a fiscal note, which clarified that General Fund expenditures are prohibited.

Senate Amendment "A" (S-377) to Committee Amendment "A" amended the resolve by making any proposal for outside funding and any contract to hire a consultant subject to review and approval by the Executive Director of the Legislative Council. The amendment also added language that gives the Legislative Council the authority to disapprove a funding source if there is a risk that accepting the funds will cause undue influence on the study.

SUMMARY

This bill would have provided that if a school administrative district's budget is not approved by July lst, the district's budget for the preceding year would become the approved budget of the current year.
