All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

LD 1555 An Act to Establish Title for Snowmobiles and All-terrain Vehicles

SUMMARY

This bill would establish a program for titling snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles of model year 1992 or later. This program would be administered by the Secretary of State.

This bill was carried over to the 2nd Regular Session by the Transportation Committee.

LD 1587 An Act to Require Minimum Training Standards for Construction Flaggers

SUMMARY

This bill would have required construction flaggers to have a minimum of 2 hours of training in directing traffic at construction sites. The bill required the Department of Transportation to develop and administer the training program.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-424) replaces the original bill. It requires that privately employed flaggers at construction sites on public ways be provided training in the techniques of directing traffic at construction sites. The type and content of the training is left to the discretion of the employer but the training must be consistent with the standards for traffic control contained in the Federal Highway Administration Manual on Traffic Control Devices. Municipalities are encouraged to provide the same training to flaggers whom they employ.

LD 1600 An Act to Increase the Penalty for Failure to Secure a Child with a Seat Belt (By Request)

SUMMARY

This bill increases the fine for violation of the child seat belt laws from \$25 to \$50 for an initial violation and from \$50 to \$200 for any subsequent violation.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-456) strikes the increase in the fine for the first violation of the child seat belt law and retains the increase to \$200 for each subsequent violation. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
