### JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE BILL SUMMARIES

### AUGUST 1991

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

#### **SUMMARY**

This bill made nondriver identification cards, issued by the Secretary of State, available to persons between 18 and 21 years of age. It required that the cards be designed so that they are readily distinguishable from nondriver identification cards issued to persons who are 21 years of age and older.

Committee Amendment "A" increased the price of the identification card from \$2 to \$5 and added a fiscal note to the bill.

House Amendment "A" added an allocation section to the bill.

#### LD 1609 An Act to Provide New Flags for the State, Governor, ONTP National Guard and Merchant and Marine

#### SUMMARY

This bill would have established new flags for the State, Governor, National Guard and for the merchant and marine. It required that model flags be procured and displayed by the Governor, the Secretary of State and the Adjutant General, and that the Secretary of State issue specifications for the new flags. The bill would have provided that the seal currently in the possession of the Secretary of State without any rays issuing from the star in the crest and without a forest and shore scene on the shield became the official state seal and state coat of arms.

### LD 1619 An Act Authorizing Issuance of an Official State Nondriver ONTP Identification Card to Persons 15 Years of Age or Older

#### SUMMARY

This bill would have reduced the age requirement from 21 to 15 years for a person to be able to obtain an official state nondriver identification card.
