This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

LD 1799 An Act to Clarify the Economic Impact Analysis in Administrative Rule-making Procedures

SUMMARY

The bill proposed to strengthen the economic impact analysis portion of the rule-making provisions of the Maine Administrative Procedure Act by requiring agencies to solicit and respond to public comment on the economic and fiscal impact of proposed rules. It also required that the economic as well as fiscal impact of proposed rules must be analyzed. This bill was carried over to the second regular session.

SUMMARY

This bill required that the voters of Cumberland County approve in a referendum vote any issue of bonds or other obligations by the Cumberland County Recreation Center, also known as the Cumberland County Civic Center, when that issue, singly or in the aggregate with previous debts incurred after October 1, 1991, exceeds \$2,000,000.

Committee Amendment "A" replaced the bill. It limited the type and amount of debt that may be incurred by the Cumberland County Recreation Center without the approval of the voters at county referendum. The voter ratification and debt limitation provisions in the amendment applied only to debt incurred by construction bonds or notes issued after October 1, 1991, and did not apply to notes issued in anticipation of federal or state aid or to other debt obligations.

Senate Amendment "A" lowered the debt limit of \$6,500,000 authorized in the committee amendment to \$5,000,000.
