AUGUST 1991

This document is a compilation of the bill summaries prepared by this office for the Joint Standing Committees and Joint Select Committees of the Maine Legislature. The volume is organized alphabetically by committee; within each committee, the summaries are arranged by LD number. A subject index is provided at the beginning of each committee's summaries.

All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

LD 1783 An Act to Amend the Waldoboro Sewer District Charter

SUMMARY

This bill changes the name of the Waldoboro Sewer District to the Waldoboro Utility District. This bill also makes technical changes to update the language of the charter. The bill raises the debt limit of the district from \$1,000,000 to \$3,000,000 and raises the amount of single expenditures which may be made by the trustees without district vote. The bill authorizes the district to purchase all the assets of the Waldoboro Water Company. The bill proposed to grant to the district a special power of eminent domain for the purpose of acquiring the entire plant, properties, franchises, rights and privileges owned by the Waldoboro Water Company. The provisions of the bill having to do with raising the debt limit and authorizing the district to purchase the Waldoboro Water Company are subject to approval by a referendum in the district.

House Amendment A (H-387) removes the provision granting eminent domain power to the district.

House Amendments B (H-430) and C (H-550) correct technical errors in the original bill.

SUMMARY

This bill increases the debt limit of the Ogunquit Sewer District from \$4,000,000 to \$7,000,000. This bill becomes effective upon approval by the voters of the Town of Ogunquit.

SUMMARY

WHITCOMB

This bill proposes to require electric utilities purchasing power from qualifying small power producers or cogenerators that use wind, water, methane or solar power as the primary energy source to pay the higher of the following: the first decrement rates or an avoided cost rate which includes environmental externalities in its calculation. This bill proposes specifically to address rate petitions that were, contemporaneous with the bill's submission, before the Public Utilities Commission involving the Foss Mill Hydroelectric Station and the North New Portland Energy Corporation.
