All adopted amendments are listed, by paper number (e.g., H - 584 or S - 222), together with the sponsor for floor amendments. Final action on each bill is listed to the right of the title. Various types of final action are abbreviated as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill would have created a new Department of Natural Resources. The new department consolidated those portions of State Government that exercise regulatory and management jurisdiction over the State's natural resources. The purpose of this consolidation was to ensure integrated natural resource policy development and implementation and realize significant efficiencies in both human and financial resources.
