SUMMARY

This bill makes a number of deallocations from the State Highway Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1991. These deallocations reflect necessary cutbacks due to the State's fiscal crisis. The bill also deallocate \$12,720,000 from the State Highway Fund for highway and bridge improvements and then allocates the same amount of money from the Federal Expenditure Fund to fund these highway and bridge improvements.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-681) clarifies the deallocation of the salary plan administered by the Department of Finance. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

SUMMARY

This bill is the same as the LD 926 as it was amended by Committee Amendment "B". LD 926 was additionally amended by House Amendment "A" to Committee Amendment "B" which added a repeal provision of July 11, 1991 to the bill. This bill was introduced and enacted to provide a permanent Highway budget for FY 1991-92 and 1992-93.

Part A of this bill provides the current services allocations from the Highway Fund and certain other funds for FY 1991-92 and 1992-93. The first year allocation is approximately \$361,250,000 with 1,967
