An Act to Expand the Definition of Tenant in the Laws Pertaining to Mobile Home Parks

SUMMARY

The bill expands the definition of "tenant" in the laws pertaining to mobile home parks to include people who rent both the land and the mobile home. Current law appears to include only persons who own the mobile home in the definition of tenant.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-920) replaces the bill with a narrower change to the law regarding mobile homes. The amendment provides that a person who rents a mobile home and rents a lot in a mobile home park is entitled to a return of a security deposit, and that a person who rents a mobile home and a lot from the mobile home park operator is entitled to a return of rent when the warranty of habitability is violated.

SUMMARY

This bill increases the amount of damages a tenant may recover for illegal evictions from \$100 to \$500.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-903) replaces the bill, and increases the minimum amount of damages a tenant may recover for an illegal eviction from \$100 to \$250.

SUMMARY

Current law requires completion of a handgun safety course as part of the application for a concealed firearms permit. The bill would have amended the statute to allow the requirement to be met if the applicant completed any firearm safety course.
