SUMMARY

LD 1397

This bill, which was carried over from the 1st Regular Session, proposed to make it the responsibility of the Department of Public Safety to clean up dead animals on the highways. The minority committee report (S-534) struck the language of the bill and replaced it with language that proposed to make it lawful for any person at any time to pick up, possess, transport or otherwise make use of any wild animal or wild bird that has been killed as a result of a collision with a motor vehicle.

SUMMARY

This bill was carried over from the 1st Regular Session. The bill establishes a special hide dealer's license that allows meat cutters to sell the skins of deer that they have butchered without obtaining a full hide dealer's license. The committee amendment (S-533) expands the special hide dealer's license to allow the holder not only to sell or barter untanned deer hides, but also untanned moose hides and moose and deer heads. This amendment also makes the special license valid from October 1st to December 31st of the year in which it is issued.
