SUMMARY

This bill clarifies the definition of ambulatory surgical facility for the purpose of state licensure and regulation.

Committee Amendment "A" (S-615) makes clarifying changes to the original bill and adds a section authorizing the Department of Human Services to increase the licensing fee for an ambulatory surgical facility from a maximum of \$250 to a maximum of \$500. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
