SUMMARY

This bill ensured that alternative rehabilitation plans for injured workers under the workers' compensation laws would be evaluated on the basis of each plan's likelihood of returning the employee to employment that is as similar as possible to the employee's skill level and wage level at the time of injury.

SUMMARY

This bill exempted emancipated minors and minors who provide totally for their own support from the limitation on hours of work for minors. It also permitted the Department of Education to establish a procedure to provide further exemptions to minors who demonstrate good cause.

An exception for emancipated minors was incorporated into LD 2213.

This bill amended the Workers' Compensation Act so that the independent medical examiner's training in and experience with the type of medical condition presented would be considered by a workers' compensation commissioner when deciding whether to adopt the examiner's medical findings.
