This bill proposed to reestablish the Rangeley Water District.

The committee amendment (S-566) added a provision to the bill to exempt it from the municipal mandate law.

House Amendment B (H-1040) replaces the committee amendment and removes Sandy River Plantation and Rangeley Plantation from the Rangeley Water District. The amendment includes an exemption from the municipal mandate law.

SUMMARY

This bill creates the Waterboro Water District.

The committee amendment (H-959) requires the Waterboro Water District to assume all rights and responsibilities of the Town of Waterboro under contracts entered into between the town and the Department of Environmental Protection. The amendment makes a technical correction to the emergency clause. The amendment adds a provision that excepts the referendum provision of the bill from the municipal mandate law.
