SUMMARY

One purpose of this bill was to ensure equal representation of both major political parties on the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices. The assistant floor leader of each house was authorized to appoint a member to the commission. The Senate appointees of 1992 will serve until 1995, and thereafter Senate appointments will be made in the odd-numbered years. The staggered terms will ensure that the commission is composed of some members who have expertise and experience in legislative ethics.

A second purpose of this bill was to provide the public in an election year with the income and liabilities of every candidate. Currently, the reporting requirements governing disclosure of income and liabilities apply only to people holding a legislative office. If a candidate has not been required to report income and liabilities to the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices, the public has no knowledge of that candidate's finances.

Legislative candidates who are not required to report to the commission by February 15th, must file this information with the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices by 5 p.m. on the first Monday in August preceding the General Election. A candidate is exempt from this requirement if the candidate withdraws from the race by the date the filing is required.

Committee amendment A (H-1061) added an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

Senate amendment A (S-767) struck out the appropriation section and replaced the fiscal note.
